Is My Child Ready for Big School?

You might have heard the term ‘school readiness’ – but what does it really mean?

What is ‘school readiness’?

Parents sometimes think that school readiness means being able to read, write and do basic maths before starting school. But this isn’t the case! School readiness is about the development of the whole child – their social and emotional skills, physical skills, communication skills and cognitive skills. Children cannot thrive at school if they haven’t developed the skills to manage things like getting along with other children, following instructions, and communicating their needs.

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Best Start Kindergarten Assessment

Best Start Kindergarten Assessment will take place at our school in Term 1.

It is a state-wide assessment that helps show teachers the literacy and numeracy skills of each student at the beginning of Kindergarten. This helps teachers to plan lessons to best support the learning needs of every child.

Children come to school with a range of experiences, skills and abilities. Some are familiar with books, can recognise letters of the alphabet or even write their name or count to ten, while others have not yet learned these skills.

Best Start Kindergarten Assessment provides teachers with the opportunity to sit with a child one on one, focusing on what that child can do.

The assessment is not a test but provides teachers with useful information to help support your child's learning at school.

School Uniform

When students wear a school uniform, they feel included in our school community. School uniform is compulsory at Haberfield Public School and we ask all parents and carers to support this policy. We also encourage you to purchase the Haberfield School Bag and Library Bag as they are durable and will be used throughout your child's time at school from Kindergarten to Year 6.

School uniforms can only be purchased at the school uniform shop (they are not sold elsewhere). The school uniform shop is managed by the school P&C Association and is staffed by volunteer parents. All profits are donated to the school, which are spent on school resources, which benefit all children.

Allergies

The School must be informed of any allergies that your child has (eg. peanuts, eggs, bee stings) or any other medical conditions, such as Asthma. If they do have an allergy or other medical condition, you need to provide the School with an Action Plan from the doctor. The plan must contain the doctor's signature, a current photo of your child, a summary of the allergy and the emergency procedures that need to be followed, such as the use of an EpiPen or ventolin.

We're an allergy-friendly school

There are students at Haberfield Public School with severe and life threatening reactions to some foods, especially nuts. We request that parents do not send their child to school with nuts, peanut butter, hazelnut spread, chocolate or biscuits containing nuts. Strict avoidance of such foods is necessary for avoiding a severe reaction. We also ask parents and carers to remind their child that sharing food is not allowed at school. These simple rules help to keep all our students safe.

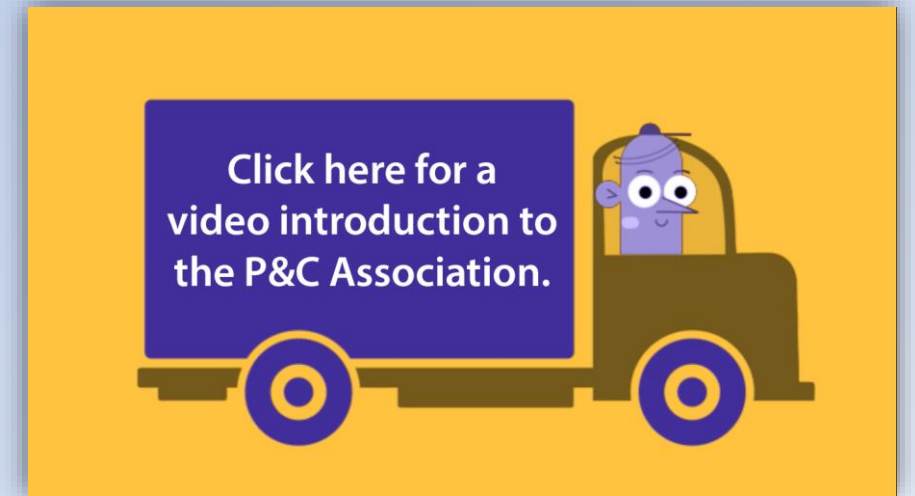


Parents and Citizens Association (P&C)

The P&C meets regularly to contribute to decision-making, developing policies and management plans as well as fundraising.

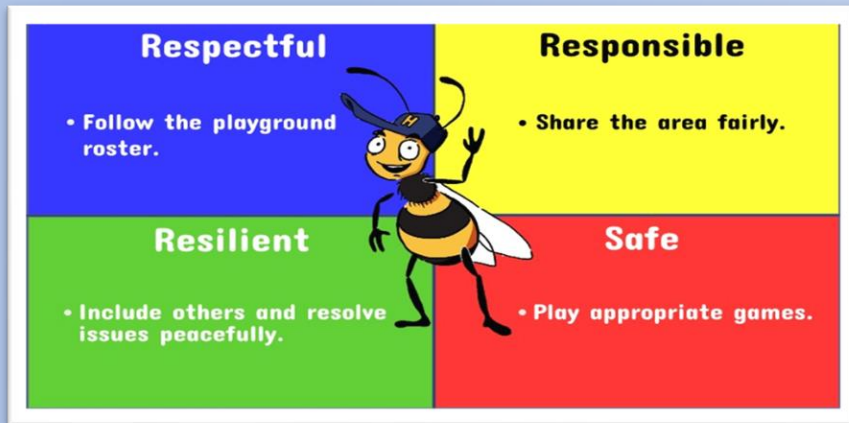

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

We are committed to ensuring a safe and happy environment for all students. *Positive Behaviour for Learning* is an evidence-based whole school process which we use to improve learning outcomes for our students.

Our whole school community works together to promote a positive, safe and supportive learning environment where students know what is expected of them. Our PBL focus areas help students make safe choices at school, become resilient learners and understand the benefits in behaving responsibly and respectfully.

Key Learning Areas

English

Students learn about the English language through written, spoken and visual texts. The study of English develops a love of literature and learning while being challenging and enjoyable.

Mathematics

Students learn to work mathematically in an interactive and hands-on learning environment. As well as a strong focus on number, students develop skills in measurement and geometry as well as in statistics.

History & Geography

In History, students share stories of their own family heritage as well as identify similarities and differences between families and family events. In Geography, students identify familiar places and recognise why some places are special or important to people.

Creative Arts

Students discover a variety of art forms through a study of dance, drama, music and visual arts. They learn to appreciate, compose, listen, make and perform. Students participate in weekly music lessons with the school Music Teacher.

PDHPE

Personal Development, Health and Physical Education
Students learn about the importance of making healthy and safe choices for themselves and others. Students also participate in challenging and enjoyable physical activity, developing their fundamental movement skills and their confidence.

Science & Technology

Students engage in the processes of Working Scientifically, and Design and Production to make sense of the world around them. They explore their surroundings and ask questions about their observations and experiences.



Community Languages

Students at Haberfield Public School participate in the Community Languages program and have the choice to study either the Italian or Mandarin languages.

By learning a second language, students will develop communication skills as well as knowledge and cultural awareness that enhance their sense of personal, community national and global identity.

Learning languages at Haberfield exercises our students' curiosity and increases their understanding of the role of languages and culture. Through the development of communicative skills, students strengthen their intellectual, analytical and reflective capabilities as well as their creative thinking.

Our Community Language classrooms can transport children to another world through music, sport, film, art, costume, festivals, food, internet, incursions, clubs, fashion and history.



Why do children at Haberfield Public School learn Italian?

- Italian is the language of music, art, food, history and culture.
- Students develop an appreciation of the culture and language of their Haberfield community.
- Students will improve their literacy skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking in Italian.

Why do children at Haberfield Public School learn Mandarin Chinese?

- Mandarin Chinese is the most spoken and used language in the world. (Ethnologue, 2019)
- Students develop skills in communicating in Chinese languages.
- Students engage in learning Pinyin and simplifying Chinese characters.



Library

We are proud of our modern, well-equipped school library with its large, comprehensive collection of books and resources.

Students participate in weekly library lessons where they further develop their love of reading. The librarian reads a story to the class, followed by borrowing time. Kindergarten students can borrow one book each week. Students can choose books to borrow from a wide range of engaging quality picture books to factual texts. Library bags are available from our School Uniform Shop.

Some exciting events that your child can look forward to include the Premier's Reading Challenge, the Book Week Parade, and book fairs throughout the year.



Learning and Support

English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D)

Some students at Haberfield Public School come from a background other than English, which means that a language other than English is spoken at home. Our EAL/D teachers provide additional support to these students. This support assists students to access the curriculum and develop the academic English language proficiency required for success at school.

Learning Support

Learning and support resources are available at Haberfield Public School to help any student experiencing difficulties with learning in their class. Our learning and support team works with students, parents and carers, classroom teachers and other professionals to identify students who need extra support.

School Counsellor

The school counsellor assists students by providing a psychological counselling, assessment and intervention service. By working collaboratively with principals, teachers, learning and support teams, parents and carers, and other agencies, the school counsellor supports the learning and wellbeing outcomes for students.



High Potential and Gifted Education

Haberfield Public School is responsive to the educational needs of all students. Classes for high potential and gifted students offer a flexible and enriched curriculum across all areas of learning. They are offered from Year 1 to Year 6 and include accelerated programs in Mathematics and English, with enrichment programs in historical, artistic and cultural studies.

At Haberfield Public School, we also offer enrichment programs for students who demonstrate talents in specific subject areas.
